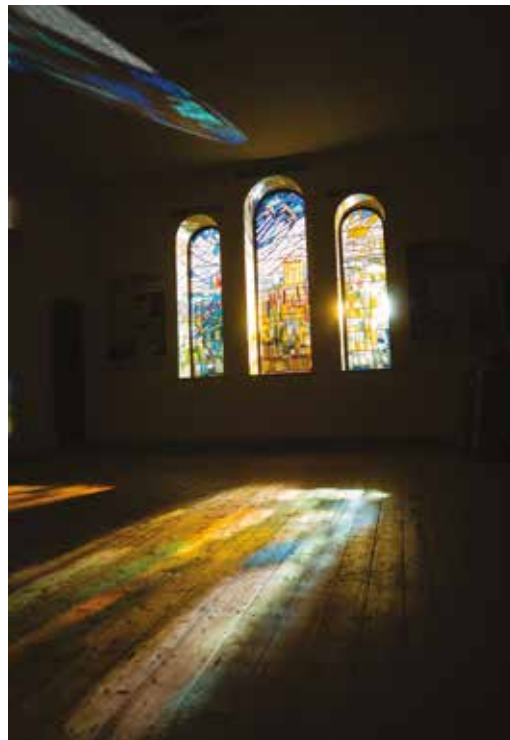
COMMUNITY CREATIVITY SHINES THROUGH AS STAINED GLASS WINDOWS INSTALLED AT THE HUB



Culmore Connections is a vibrant intergenerational project celebrating the rich cultural diversity of our community. Bringing together partners including Muff Community Partnership, Waterside Presbyterian Church Group, St Augustine's Church of Ireland, Culmore Youth Club, Culmore Primary School, and Hollybush Primary School, the project has created meaningful opportunities for people of all ages to connect, share, and create together.

Funded through Derry City and Strabane District Council's PEACEPLUS Local Co-Designed Action Plan, supported by the Special EU Programme Body (SEUPB), Culmore Connections has grown into a truly community-led initiative.

Since its launch in 2024, an incredible 170 people have taken part, each contributing their own experiences, perspectives, and creativity. Through shared visits to Fort Dunree, the Tower Museum, the Maritime



Museum, and the Siege Museum, participants built new friendships while exploring the history, heritage, and traditions that shape our area.

The project also delivered a series of storytelling and creative writing workshops, where participants worked together to capture memories and reflections of life in Culmore and Muff, creating a lasting collection of community voices.

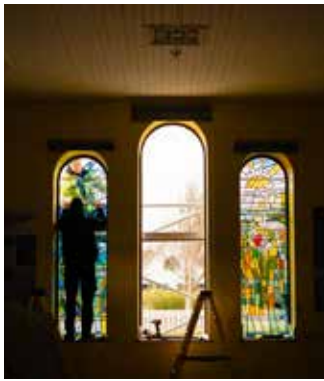

During the project, participants worked side by side with local artists, sharing ideas, artwork, and inspiration. Every contribution, no matter how big or small, helped shape the final designs, ensuring the windows are a true reflection of the community.

Artist Mark Hackett thoughtfully brought together this wealth of community-created artwork into a cohesive and inspiring final design, symbolising a new chapter for the former Victoria Hall as it continues its transformation into the welcoming and inclusive Culmore Community Hub.

The windows were expertly produced and installed by Alpha Stained Glass, who carefully refined the designs to suit the stained glass medium while preserving the spirit and detail of the community's vision.

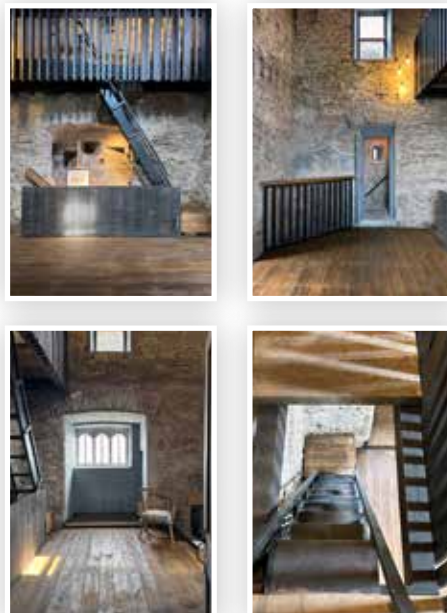

OPERATING HOURS & ELIGIBILITY

- When: Monday–Thursday, 3:00p.m.–5:00p.m. (Term time only)
- Who's eligible: Culmore Primary School & Hollybush Primary School pupils

SUPERVISION & SUPPORT

- Children are collected at 3:00p.m. from their school gates at Culmore PS and Hollybush PS.
- A snack and drink awaits them at the Hub.
- Pupils work on their own assigned homework, supervised by staff.
- Staff offer guidance and direction, not formal marking or corrections.
- Final review and completion responsibility remains with parents/guardians.

After finishing homework, children can choose from:

- Quiet study
- Drawing or creative art
- Early-finisher worksheets (Non-school related materials and activities are not permitted.)
